RE: Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (Fair Labor Standards Act Overtime Provisions)

Dear Executive Director:

On behalf of the Architect of the Capitol (AOC), my office has reviewed the notice of proposed rulemaking published on the Congressional Record on April 26, 2022, concerning new and revised overtime provisions for covered employees in the Legislative Branch. We have no substantive comments regarding these proposed rules.

We would just like to highlight that, on May 2, 2022, subsequent to the OCWR transmission of proposed rulemaking, the United States Supreme Court granted certiorari in <u>Helix Energy Solutions Group v. Hewitt</u>, a 5th Circuit case involving the interpretation and application of regulations exempting "highly compensated employees." It is conceivable that any decision rendered by the Supreme Court could impact the application of the proposed regulations.
